Biblical study tours illuminate the Jewish roots of the Christian faith, helping believers from many nations understand God's continued role for the Jewish people.


Hospitality ministries give both Israelis and pilgrims a safe haven for resting, exploring the Land and seeking an encounter with God.

Rev. Aaron Eime



Rev Aaron Eime is the deacon of Christ Church in the Old City of Jerusalem, the first Protestant Church in the Middle East. He has a Masters Degree in Jewish Civilization from the Hebrew University in Israel., with a major in Early Jewish and Christian Interpretation of the Bible. Aaron also studied Psychology and Sociology at Queensland University in Australia. He is a gifted and dedicated Bible teacher exploring the Hebraic Roots of the Christian Faith. He has taught

Internationally in many countries including Europe, North America, Hong Kong and China. Aaron is the Director of the Heritage Centre at Christ Church, preserving the unique history and influence of the Protestant arrival into the Middle East in the 19th Century. He lives in Jerusalem with his wife and 3 children.

Teaching Topics and Ideas

Kingdom of Heaven - Jesus uses the term Kingdom of Heaven in nearly every parable and teaching he gives. So what does He mean and what do the disciples understand by that. Also gives us a chance to explore a few parables.

Gospel according to Moses - if you were a 1st century Jew, what is the good news to you? You only have Hebrew Bible. Remember that Paul never quotes a gospel, nor does he quote Jesus, so how do you get Faith, Hope and Love from the Hebrew Bible?

Jewish influences in Mark - the gospels are finely crafted texts, the miracles and narratives are well chosen and in particular order to speak to us, using that subtext then we can explore passages in Mark and reveal some Jewish character.

Jesus use of Scripture in Luke - how does Jesus use the Hebrew Bible to explain His mission and who He is.

Psalm 95, Psalm 92, Hebrews 3-4 and the Talmud Sanhedrin 98 all converge together in talking about Messiah, Shabbat and Redemption.

Deuteronomy 8 and the Command to Remember - Remember is the most common command G-d ever gives to people in the Bible, what does it mean to remember, and link that to Jesus command to 'do this to remember.'

Aaron also teaches seminars on reading the Bible from a Hebraic perspective.
