- ◆ To encourage and support the global Messianic movement and pray for the peace of Jerusalem.
- ◆ To evangelize by sharing the Good News of salvation in Jesus as Messiah (Yeshua Hamashiach) to both Jew and Gentile and proclaim the return of the King.

CMJ— Where did it start?

The history of CMJ Israel is amazing. Beginning in Britain in 1809, a move of God resulted in an awakening which drew believers into the Scripture in a new way. Many were people of influence, church leaders and politicians (including founding member, William Wilberforce). Through their study of the Word, they recognized the plan of God to restore the Nation of Israel and the Jewish people to the Land. Believing they were called of God to engage in this process, they began to pray as to how they could be a presence in the Land in order to reach out to the Jewish people.

Through prayer, diligence and geo-political changes within Europe, CMJ UK was able to build a consulate in Jerusalem and later a chapel which became Christ Church. This was completed around 1845—the **first Protestant church in the Holy Land!**

CMJ built the first hospitals and schools in Israel and assisted in many projects to provide work and improve living conditions. With its rich heritage of 200 years of service and present diversity of ministries, CMJ continues in Israel and the nations to bridge ethnic, religious and national boundaries sharing the reconciling love of Jesus with both Jewish people and the nations.

CMJ in Israel continues its ministry of being a witness to both Jews and Gentiles of God's love and faithfulness as found in Jesus the Messiah. Today we express this in many practical ways: supporting and educating local believers, praying for the peace of Jerusalem, combating anti-Semitism, teaching Christians about their Jewish roots, and proclaiming the return of the King.

As CMJ Canada we are grateful to participate in this ministry for such a time as this.
